

Senior Citizen Bill of Rights Pocket Guide



1

The right to vote, or not vote. The choice is yours, and yours alone.

2

The right to refuse assistance from unknown persons or persons you don't want help from.

3

The right to privacy. No one has the right to ask you about your personal and private voting preferences or make a voting suggestion. Voting is confidential!

4

The right to redress. If you believe your rights have been violated, you can report this to your local election official.

5

The right to request candidate visits at your residence. Ask your resident manager to invite candidates of all parties to visit your residence, hear your concerns, and explain their policy positions.

You have the right to participate as little,
or as much, as you want.
